### **NEW MEMBER SPOTLIGHT**

This month we are highlighting new member **Bettty Anne Clayton.** 

Betty Anne's family of origin wintered in Villanova, PA and summered in Ocean City, NJ.

Princeton was a lovely, quiet village, in 1961, when she came as a student-wife to study at Princeton Theological Seminary. Sixty years later, Princeton is still a very favorite place of hers. Her career in education began as a high school home economics teacher in Freehold Township. She went on to serve as a Vice-Principal, NJ State Supervisor and the NJ State Program Director for the Modelnetics Management Training Program at Rutgers University.

In mid-life, she studied the field of gerontology and subsequently, directed the Union County College Gerontology program where she taught the sociology & psychology of aging courses.

After moving to Wellesley, MA, Betty Anne was a visiting professor at Wheaton College where she taught Aging in America.

When her husband was transferred to Houston, TX, she directed the Aging Texas Well community research grant at Lone Star College. One significant outcome of the research was the creation of the Academy for Lifelong Learning. She was privileged to serve as the founding President of the Board of Directors.

An important period of spiritual growth in her life was during her ten years as a national seminar leader for the Spiritual Eldering Institute in Boulder, CO. During that time, Betty Anne authored Spiritual Elders: Women of Worth in the Third Millennium which was used as a fundraiser for the institute while she was serving on the Board of Directors.

Betty Anne lost her beloved husband in November of 2021, but is blessed with three fine children, six grands and two greats. Her oldest daughter Lisa lives on Beacon Hill in Boston, MA and her younger daughter Jamie lives in San Mateo, CA. They both think they live in the last best place! Fortunately, her son Brent lives in Monroe Township, NJ, close to Princeton, her favorite place.

Church and community service keeps this octogenarian happy and active. Betty Anne is looking forward to making new friends at WCCP.
