LUNCH OUT



DESSERTS

Combine crumbs, ½ cup sugar and melted butter. Press into bottom of 9" x 13" pan. Beat cream cheese with sugar and milk until smooth. Fold in half of the Cool Whip; spread on crumb layer. Prepare the chocolate pudding with 3½ cups milk and pour over cheese layer. Chill several hours or overnight. Spread remaining Cool Whip on top and decorate with grated chocolate and/or chopped nuts. Serves 15-18

APPLE CUSTARD

- 4 eggs (OR 5 egg whites and 1 whole egg)
- 4 cups milk OR 3 cups evaporated milk and 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 T honey
 1/2 t vanilla
- 4 apples, peeled and sliced

Beat eggs with milk, sugar, honey and vanilla. Stir in sliced apples. Pour into ovenware casserole; bake in preheated 325° oven for about 40 minutes. May be topped with whipped cream.
